








### Overview of CDBG Program



Meridian's CDBG Program receives funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to promote decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic opportunities principally for persons with low to moderate incomes.

## Who's Eligible?

Services are for Meridian resident's that are at or below 80% of the area median income (AMI).

2 Person	\$57,050





# Impediment 3: Concern w/ Fair Housing Violations in the Rental Market

All documented fair housing violations pertained to people renting housing.

 Provide education to rental management/rental property organizations

\*While 34 Meridian residents reported a fair housing violation in the AI survey, Idaho Legal Aid only received 17 complaints,
